Ragging is an Offence & it is Punishable under the Law

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In the year 1969, Dr. (Capt) D.V.P. Raja an ardent young man with full of imagination, vision and mission come to Madurai from Rajapalayam to create and build an academic institution of high order to develop and mould young men and women and to involve them heart and soul in National Development programme.

With the cooperation and blessings of many nationalistic minded leaders in Madurai, Madurai Institute of Social Work was founded by Dr. (Capt) Raja on Gandhiji Birth Centenary Day, the 2nd Oct 1969, with the meaningful message of "Our Nation Our Home, One Nation One World".

Madurai Institute of Social Work commenced functioning with a mere handful of 4 students in the beginning, which has grown now like a deeply rooted banyan tree to give shade to more than 1,000 students, who are able to develop their skill and will and thus serve the Society effectively.

Changing educational climate did not deter Dr. Raja's commitment to Professional Social Work for a very long time, In the beginning of 1990, a ray of vision of future leads him to make the institute into a multifaculty research center. A post graduate programme in Human Resource Management, first of its kind in India was started. Madurai Kamaraj University recognized the Institute as a research center to conduct both M.Phil and Ph.D. programmes.

The onset of computers, even in the field of human services, again tilted his vision of future and introduce computer based courses at under graduate and post graduate level in the year 1998. Presently the institution offers two research degrees, four master degrees, seven under graduate degrees and two diploma degrees, admitting around 1,000 students every year. It has become an autonomous college and Re Accredited with 'B+' Grade by NAAC in 2019.

VARIOUS ACTIVITIES UNDER PART IV

Under Part IV of the curriculum various activities are conducted through National Service Scheme, Red Ribbon Club, Youth Red Cross and Physical Education. The National Service Scheme of our college has two units.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Students are requested to wear their **Identity Card** compulsorily **all the time** while they are at college. Students without ID cards will not allowed to enter the campus.
2. Students are informed to report at college by 9.40 A.M. with necessary study materials. College gate will be closed by 9.50am.
3. Students should attend the common prayer organized at 9.45 AM through the Public Addressing System every day.
4. Students should avoid wearing Jeans, Short shirt, T shirt, legins inside the campus all the time.
5. Girl Students should wear only Churidhar with Shawl.
6. Use of mobile phone is strictly prohibited inside the campus.
7. Ragging in any form is prohibited. Stringent action will be taken against defaulters as per UGC guidelines.
8. The College believes that discipline is the hallmarks of a good student. Even teasing, disruption of class room activities or disturbing the studies of other students or damaging the college property, possession of any intoxicants or illicit drugs or weapons in the college campus, misconduct during examination etc. would be deemed to be acts of indiscipline. Therefore erring students would be subjected to disciplinary action like fine, suspension and dismissal. The serious offences will be referred to police station. Day scholars using two-wheeler should use Helmet and park their vehicles only in the student's parking area. Students should keep their vehicles duly locked and the College will not be responsible for any loss of vehicles.
9. For organizing functions, conferences, meetings or any other gathering of this kind, they should get prior permission of the Principal through HOD.
10. Students are advised keep the College Office / Department concerned informed about any change in their local / permanent addresses / contact numbers (landline / mobile).

Scholarships: Fee concessions and other scholarships are awarded to SC / ST / MBC / DNC / BC students of the P.G. and U.G. Classes as per the prescribed Government rules. Students are eligible for the scholarship fund only when they have the required percentage of attendance in attending classes.

Rules & Regulations relating to Attendance and Leave or Absence for Students

- Students should be *regular and punctual* to all classes.
- Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each hour. Late comers will not be admitted to the class without an admit - chit from the Head of the Department / Principal.
- A student who is not in the class when attendance is taken will be marked as absent.
- The working day will be 5 hours and each class will be 55 minutes duration. First 3 hours will be forenoon session and remaining 2 hours will be afternoon session. If the student absent in any one of the hour in the forenoon session will be considered as half day absent and in the same in the afternoon session.
- Students should produce leave letters for absents themselves from the class, duly signed by Parent or Guardian and deputy warden in the case of hostel students.
- No student should absent himself/herself from the college without prior notice except in case of sudden illness or any other emergency
- The leave application shall be submitted to the Faculty in charge and get the signature of Faculty in-charge, HOD and submit it to the Faculty In - charge.
- If the leave is for more than 5 days, get the signature of the principal and submit the application to the concerned Faculty of In - charge.
- In the case of leave for more than a week on account of illness, a medical certificate from the authorized medical officer shall be produced on the first day of illness. Then fitness certificate shall be produced on the day of reporting for class.
- Number of working days in each semester is not less than 90 days.
- Students must have 75% of attendance of the total number of working days and have completed all the requirements of formative assessment, will be permitted to appear for the summative examination.
- Students who have 65% to 74.99% of attendance shall apply for condonation in the prescribed form with the prescribed fee and they shall be permitted to write examinations.
- Students who have 50% to 64.99% of attendance shall apply for special condonation in prescribed form with the prescribed fee and they are eligible to appear for examinations in the next semester only.
- Students who have below 50% of attendance are not eligible to appear for the

- examination including practical. They shall re-do the semester(s) after the completion of the programme.
- Students should not abstain themselves for tests and examinations. Absentees will be severely dealt with.
- The faculty in charge shall send or inform the attendance details to the parents on every month.

LIBRARY

The college library will be kept open from 8.30 am to 5.30 pm on all working days for the use of students and staff.

The students, staff and Alumni of this institute are admitted as members. The outsiders may be permitted to use the library after getting written permission from the Principal.

Borrowing procedure

Member can borrow books and back volumes of periodicals meant for circulation. Current issues of periodicals will not be available for lending.

The Post Graduate student member is allowed to borrow maximum 3 books/back volumes. The U.G. student member is allowed to borrow maximum 2 books/back volumes. The staff member's canas1 borrow maximum of 6 books at a time. The Alumni members are allowed to borrow 2 books at a time. LOAN PERIOD: Loan period will be 7days for student members and 15 days for staff.

PLACEMENT CELL

The college established the placement bureau in the year 1999 and plays an active role in the placement of students. The bureau is coordinated by committee consisting of senior faculty as coordinator assisted by, all heads of the departments and two students from each department.

Alumni network is strengthened with the firm hope that such a network would help in the identification and promotion of job opportunities for our outgoing students.

HOSTEL

- ✓ Hostel facility is available for Boys and Girls separately inside the Institute Campus.
 - ✓ Guests/friends are not allowed into the student's room/mess at any time.
 - ✓ Hostellers will not be allowed outside hostel/college campus after 8.30 pm. for Boys and 6.00 p.m. for Girls.
 - ✓ Outside food shall not be brought into the hostel premises.
 - ✓ No students are allowed to entertain guests including parents between 6.00pm and 7.00 am.
 - ✓ Parents are allowed to visit hostel only on Saturday and Sunday (2.00pm to 6.00pm)
 - ✓ During class hours no student shall stay in the hostel without permission.
 - ✓ The students are not permitted to change the room with others. The management reserves full right to re – allot or change the room without assigning any reason.
 - ✓ When a student goes out of the hostel for his native place or for training for more than three days, he should handover the keys of the room to the Deputy warden and get the gate pass.
- The rules and regulations as mentioned above can be amended from time to time without prior notice and the decision taken by the management pertaining to College / Hostel is final.

NSS Unit 104 & 228

Apart from in campus and out campus activities NSS Special Camp (7 days) is organized once in a year which is compulsory for all volunteers.

Madurai Institute of Social Sciences does not accept capitation fee or donation for any admission. If anyone promises admission to the college or hostel on the consideration, the matter should be brought to the notice of Principal/Secretary immediately. Canvassing any form including recommendation letters and offering donation will disqualify a student from admission.

STUDENT CLUBS

HR Study Circle

The students specializing MSW HRM and MHRM started this study circle in the year 2007 to organize guest lecture, training, seminar, Quiz etc. to the students and professionals working in industries. The circle organizes national level seminar once a year, invites guest speaker from parts of the country to develop networking with different HR professionals. HR Study circle development fund was created to strengthen the departmental activities, to develop networking and to strengthen the placement activities.

Consumer Club

A “Consumer Club” was functioning in our college to find the solutions in our day today consumer problems. This is the first of its kind among Madurai city colleges. The aim is to create awareness about consumer issues and assist the students to find our solution for their problems. The students are encouraged to represent their grievance to the appropriate authorities for remedy.

EXAMINATIONS

CONDUCT OF COMPREHENSIVE EXAMINATIONS

All comprehensive examinations (Theory and Practical) shall be conducted twice in a year, November/December and April/May. Students having a minimum of 75 % of attendance out of total working days alone will be permitted to write Theory examinations and practical examinations.

Rules to be observed in the Examination Hall

1. Students without hall ticket and ID card will not be permitted for any examination.
2. Students will not be permitted for examination after 30 minutes from the commencement of examination
3. Students shall not leave the hall within half an hour from the commencement of examination.
4. Students should not write their names or any other identification marking, except their register number in the answer scripts.
5. Students should maintain pin drop silence in the examination hall
Students should bring their own requirements like Pen, Pencil, Calculator for the examination, and should not borrow from others)
6. The students should come of formal dress

Malpractices in Examination

- I Candidates scribbling on the question paper, requesting for pass or writing an appeal to the examiner coupled with promise of any form of consideration will be served with a warning that recurrence will attract severe punishments.
- II
 - a. Candidates found in possession of material written in the form of printed, Xeroxed / cyclostyled, / hand written or in any form means i.e., written on paper, cloth, scale, furniture etc. but found not to have copied from the above.
 - b. Candidate leaving the hall within half an hour from the time of commencement of examination, with or without question / answer paper.
 - c. Candidate being abetted by another candidate but not in possession of any incriminating materials / and not made use of it in the examination.

Punishment

The particular examination taken by the candidate and previous examinations written will be cancelled and he / she will not be permitted to write the rest of the examinations, if any, in that semester, including supplementary examination.

Condonation for Attendance

75 % of attendance out of total working days	Permitted to write examinations
65 % to 74 % of Attendance	Condonation fees Rs. 360 along with regular examination fees
50 % to 64.99 % of Attendance	condonation fees Rs. 600 along with regular examination fees and they are eligible to appear for examinations in the next semester only
Less than 50 % of Attendance	Not eligible to appear for the examination. They shall re-do particular semester(s) after the completion of the programme by paying tuition fees and attending regular classes.

Reappearing Candidates

1. A student who has arrears in any paper in a semester examination will be permitted to attend the next semester. A student who has arrears in paper / papers of that semester examinations may appear again in these failed papers in the next examinations. The Internal Assessment marks already obtained by him/her shall be carried over. A student who fails in any theory paper will be allowed to re-appear for that paper in the succeeding examinations under the same syllabus, only for a period of 5 years, from his date of joining. Beyond that the candidate has to reappear only in the latest revised syllabus, and he has to prepare for that new syllabus on his own. He can be allowed only to write that particular examinations, and he could obtain the degree. In case he needs any equivalence he will be given after placing it to the experts..
2. Supplementary examination shall be conducted immediately after publishing the final semester results. Those students who have failed in the examination, shall be permitted to appear for two papers in the supplementary examination. (*one paper from the final semester, any one paper from any other previous semester*).
The Principal can condone the attendance under the extraordinary conditions.

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

Ragging is banned and anyone indulging is liable to be punished as per law.

Ragging means any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

- ✓ Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences
- ✓ Extortions
- ✓ Criminal trespass
- ✓ Offences against property
- ✓ Criminal intimidations
